Goal #1

Measurable School Goal: During the 2018 – 2019 school year, 91% of Terrace Community Middle School students will earn a passing score on the FSA ELA reading and writing assessment.

Baseline: During the 2017 – 2018 school year, 89% of Terrace Community Middle School students earned a passing score on the FSA ELA reading and writing assessment.

Anticipated Outcome: Measurable school goal will be met.

Goal #2

Measurable School Goal: During the 2018 – 2019 school year, 77% of TCMS students will demonstrate learning gains on the FSA ELA reading and writing assessment.

Baseline: During the 2017-2018 school year, 74% of Terrace Community Middle School students demonstrated learning gains on the FSA ELA reading and writing assessment.

Anticipated Outcome: Measurable school goal will be met.

Goal #3

Measurable School Goal: During the 2018 – 2019 school year, 77% of TCMS students in the lower quartile will demonstrate learning gains on the FSA ELA reading and writing assessment.

Baseline: During the 2017-2018 school year, 67% of Terrace Community Middle School students in the lower quartile demonstrated learning gains on the FSA ELA reading and writing assessment.

Baseline: During the 2017-2018 school year, 79% of Terrace Community Middle School students in the lower quartile demonstrated learning gains on the FSA Mathematics assessment.

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Measurable School Goal: During the 2018-2019 school year, 95% of Terrace Community Middle School students enrolled in an algebra course at TCMS will earn passing score on the FSA Algebra EOC exam.

Baseline: During the 2017-2018 school year, 95% of students enrolled in an algebra course at Terrace Community Middle School passed the Algebra EOC exam.

Goal #8

Measurable School Goal: During the 2018-2019 school year, 100% of Terrace Community Middle School students enrolled in a Geometry course at TCMS will earn passing score on the FSA Geometry EOC exam.

Baseline: During the 2017-2018 school year, 98% of students enrolled in a Geometry course at Terrace Community Middle School passed the Geometry EOC exam.

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School Climate Goals:

Measurable School Goal:

- 1) During the 2018 – 2019 school year Terrace Community Middle School will reduce the number of students with ten or more absences to 5%.
- 2) During the 2017 – 2018 school year Terrace Community Middle School will reduce the number of students with ten or more unexcused absences to 2%.

Baseline:

- 1) During the 2017 – 2018 school year, students with 10 or more absences equaled 5.15%.
- 2) During the 2017 – 2018 school year, students had 10 or more unexcused absences equaled 2.7%.

Anticipated Outcome: Measurable school goal will be met.

Strategies:

- Increase awareness and communication between parents and school.
- Attendance committee will meet on a regular basis about attendance issues.
- Data processor will communicate excessive absences to Grade Level Administrators and counselor.
- Grade Level Administrators and/or counselor will conference with families and students with excessive tardies and absences.
- Grade Level Administrators and/or counselor will develop and implement interventions for students with excessive tardies/absences.
- Notification from the school will be sent to parents for students with excessive absences and tardies each quarter.
- Students with perfect attendance will recognized during the spring school awards ceremony.
- Student attendance may impact participation in school extra-curricular clubs, sports, and activities.

Measurable School Goal: During the 2018 – 2019 school year Terrace Community Middle School will maintain the number of reported incidences of substantiated bullying to be no more than 1 incidences.

Baseline:

- 1) During the 2017 – 2018 school year, there were 3 reported incidents of substantiated bullying. The number of reported bullying incidents increased from 23 to 27 incidents.

Anticipated Outcome: Measurable school goal will be met

Strategies:

- Provide training on bullying for teachers and faculty before the beginning of the school year & during the school year.

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- Utilize extended homeroom time for implementing character education/bullying prevention lessons.
- Continue to grow and develop a climate of peer respect & kindness.
- Students and Teachers will sign the Anti-bullying pledge through homerooms.
- Students and faculty will participate in Blue Shirt Day, World Day of Bullying Prevention.
- Create opportunities for student leadership to foster an inherent sense of tolerance, kindness, and respect for diversity.
- Students and faculty participate in Mix-It-Up Days.
- Bullying resources, strategies, and tips will be posted on the school counseling webpage.
- Communicate and increase school-wide opportunities for service learning/volunteerism of students.
- Provide ongoing support and training on effective classroom management techniques.
- Communicate the means for students to report bullying and harassment.
- Utilize monitoring systems to record and investigate bullying and harassment.
- Promote positive character building messages through posters throughout the school.
- Promote positive character building messages through the daily *Words of Wisdom* program on the WTCMS Morning Show & character education videos.
- Promote positive character through student recognition programs such as Do the Right Thing, Tornadoes of the Week, and TTPD.
- Teach students Digital Citizenship & Cyberbullying strategies during Bullying Prevention Month in October.
- Implement school-wide events including Random Acts of Kindness Week in February.
